United States Navy Biography

Commander Diego H. Londoño 3d Marine Aircraft Wing Camp Pendleton

Chaplain Londoño was born in Colombia and immigrated to the United States in 1991. He completed college seminary (Philosophy and Bible Studies concentration) in 1991 at San Pedro Apostol Seminary in Cali, Colombia, earned a Master of Divinity, Cum Laude, from St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary, Boynton Beach, FL in 1995, a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology in 2005, and a Master of Arts in Mental Health Counseling, with Honors, in 2009 both from Rollins College, Winter Park, FL. Chaplain Londoño completed the Navy Fleet Marine Force Qualified Officer (FMFQO) program in April 2012 and was awarded the College of Distance Education Command and Staff Diploma (JPME-I) by the United States Naval War College in May 2015. After selection for the Advanced Educational Program, Pastoral Care Residency, Chaplain Londoño earned four additional clinical pastoral education units from October 2018 to September 2019 at the Hampton Roads CPE Center.



Operational tours included 2nd Medical Battalion from November 2010 to October 2012 with temporary assigned duty to Combat Logistics Battalion 22 (CLB-22) deploying with the 22D Marine Expeditionary Unit (22d MEU) in support of Operations ODYSSEY DAWN and UNIFIED PROTECTOR-JOA LIBYA, and the USS CARTER HALL (LSD 50) from December 2015 to July 2018 deploying to BALTOPS 2016 and with the 2017 Bataan Amphibious Ready Group embarking the 24th Marine Expeditionary Unit (24th MEU). He reported to 3d Marine Aircraft Wing Camp Pendleton in January 2023. Shore duty tours comprised a special program at the Naval Consolidated Brig Chesapeake from December 2012 to November 2015 and a payback assignment at Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command, Portsmouth from October 2019 to December 2022.

Cdr. Londoño facilitates Seven Habits for Highly Effective People® (Franklin Covey), Myers-Briggs Type Indicator® Steps I & II (CPP), Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST), Caregiver Occupational Stress Control (CgOSC), and One Love workshops. He is a Registered Mental Health Counselor Intern, Military Status, in the State of Florida, and holds Resilience-Building Leadership Professional Trainer (RBLP-T) and Blue Dragon Hyper-Integrated Causal Analysis Practitioner (BD2) certifications. His personal awards include the Navy and Marine Corp Commendation Medal (3 stars) and the Navy and Marine Corp Achievement Medal. The Communion of Evangelical Episcopal Churches endorses Chaplain Londoño. He is a Board Certified Chaplain with the National Association of Veterans Affairs Chaplains.
