

## **Colonel Anna Maltese Voyne, USMC**

A native of Guadalajara, Mexico, Colonel Voyne earned her commission through the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps program at the University of San Diego, graduating in 2001 with a Bachelor of Arts in International Relations. After completing the Basic Officer Course and the Finance Officer Course in 2002, 2ndLt Voyne executed orders to Marine Corps Air Station Miramar where she remained until 2005; she deployed to Kuwait in support of OPERATION IRAQI FREEDOM (OIF) in 2003.

In 2006, Captain Voyne became an Intelligence Officer after graduating from the Marine Air Ground Task Force Intelligence Officer Course. She received orders to III Marine Expeditionary Force in Okinawa, Japan where she served as the G-2 Air Combat Element OIC from 2007 to 2008.

In 2008, Captain Voyne reported for duty to 3rd Marine Air Wing in Camp Pendleton, California as the Marine Aircraft Group 39 Headquarters S-2 OIC. In 2009, she deployed to Iraq in support of OIF, serving as Finance Intelligence Officer for Multi-National Corps-Iraq.

In 2010, Captain Voyne reported to the Naval Postgraduate School (NPS) for training as a China Foreign Area Officer (FAO). She graduated with High Honors from the Defense Language Institute's Mandarin Chinese Course and received a master's degree in security studies from NPS in March 2012. In June 2012, Major Voyne moved to Beijing, China to execute In Country Training where she traveled extensively through China and Southeast Asia.

From 2013 to 2015, Major Voyne was assigned as the lead planner and Deputy G-2 at 3d Marine Expeditionary Brigade in Okinawa, Japan. As a China FAO, Major Voyne leveraged her skills by representing the U.S. military forces in Taiwan and China.

In the summer of 2015, Major Voyne received orders to Marine Cryptologic Support Battalion in Fort Meade, Maryland, where she served until 2017, supporting the National Security Agency's worldwide mission.

Major Voyne graduated from the School of Advanced Warfighting in 2018. Upon graduation, LtCol Voyne received orders to Marine Corps Forces, Pacific (MARFORPAC), where she remained until 2021 serving as Commander's Action Group Director, lead planner for the China Operations Plan, and MARFOPAC G-2 Lead Planner. From 2021-2022, LtCol Voyne served as the 1st MAW G-2 in Okinawa, Japan.

In June 2022, LtCol Voyne assumed command of the Marine Corps Detachment, Presidio of Monterey (MCD PoM) supporting the Defense Language Institute, Naval Postgraduate School, and Naval Air Station Lemoore. Colonel Voyne currently serves as the Director of Plans and Strategy under the Deputy Commandant for Information.
